

Armenian International Medical Fund Sets Milestone:

42 Impaired Children Received the "Gift of Hearing" Since 2004

LOS ANGELES - Armenian International Medical Fund (AIM Fund) successfully completed its 7th medical mission in Armenia from November 18th to 24th of 2010.

Since 2004, 42 hearing impaired children and young adults have received the "gift of hearing" through cochlear implant surgery with 100% success rate. Children are attending normal schools and receiving high marks in their academic work.

During this mission, volunteer professionals from UCLA Health System, Dr. Akira Ishiyama, Alison Grimes and Salpy Akaragian, operated on 8 children, participated in a conference and opened the training center for temporal bone drilling, which is the first in the Region.

The surgeries took place at Erebouni Medical Center with the support of the Armenian Prime Minister, Tigran Sargsian, Minister of Health, Dr. Artium Kushkyan, Drs. Nara Mamikonyan, Arthur Shukuryan, Armine Martirosyan, Vigen Bakhshinyan and Ms. Inessa Harutyunyan.

The success of the mission is due to the dedication and commitment of many individuals from Armenia, Europe and the United States. In addition, Stryker and cochlear corporations, Erebouni Medical Center and Garo Mardirossian Law Firm donated multiple pieces of equipment and partial donation of a cochlear implant for this mission.

The Armenian International Medical Fund (AIM Fund) marks another successful year for 2009. The foundation, also known as the "ear project" is receiving recognition throughout the Armenian community not only in California but the rest of the world as well. In 2009, a total of 5 candidates received the "gift of hearing" by surgically placing multi-channel electrodes (part of the device) in the inner ear. These children ranged from 2 to 6 years of age and also included a 20 year old artist who recently lost his hearing. Prior to the New Year, the devices were "switched on", all the recipients were able to hear and families

celebrated the New Year with great joy and hope.

Due to individuals like you who possess the utmost compassion, as of today 34 young children and adults hear, speak and take part in their society. The success of these implants for all the recipients is 100%.

Plans are now underway to implant additional children in 2010, with the help of the Armenian Community, Ministry of Health and professionals from Armenia and the US. These surgeries are performed at Erebouni Medical Center in Yerevan, Armenia under the leadership of Drs. Akira Ishiyama (UCLA) Arthur

Shukuryan (Erebouni) and Mrs. Salpy Akaragian, RN-BC, MN (UCLA).
